OUR NATION (The empty pulpit)

The voting season is upon us and men and women are ignorant or unwilling to vote which can make a difference in our nation for good of course you understand not all. Quick Bio-glance:



Absalom Backus Earle, 1812-1895

A. B. Earle was born in Charlton, New York. He was converted at the age of sixteen and began preaching two years later. He spent the next three years studying and preaching. At the age of twenty-one he was ordained at Amsterdam, New York. After pastoring there for five years, Earle felt led by the Lord to enter the evangelistic ministry. The next fifty-eight years of his life were spent holding meetings in the United States (every state) and Canada. He held 39,330 services, traveled 370,000 miles, led 160,000 souls to Christ, and earned a total of \$65,520 for his sixty-four years of ministry. He influenced 400 men to enter the ministry.

Earle authored the following books: *Bringing in the Sheaves*, *Abiding Peace*, *Rest of Faith*, *The Human Will*, *The Work of an Evangelist*, *Evidences of Conversion*, and *Winning Souls*. He died at his home in Newton, Massachusetts, March 30, 1895, at the age of eighty-three.

A writer in a leading British religious paper said concerning Mr. Earle: "His preaching was not eloquent. His delivery was not beyond the average. His voice had no special power. His large angular frame and passionless mouth were decidedly against him. His sermons seemed sometimes as though composed thirty years ago, before we so often heard, as now, the more clear and ringing utterances of free grace, and the name of Jesus in almost every sentence. He expressed his own emotions very simply, and did not often refer to them. His rhetoric was often at fault, and sometimes his grammar. Truly the enticing words of man's wisdom were wanting in his case."

1Th 3:5 so called,

When he is here said to
come to Christ at the

now appeared openly,
and in a visible shape:
all the forty days and
nights before, he had
been tempting him
secretly and inwardly;
suggesting things
suitable to, and taking

MONTHLY MEMORY VERSE

Part II

Read Matthew 4:10 (KJV)

Then saith Jesus unto him, Get thee hence, Satan: for it is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and him only shalt thou serve.

Temped when alone

Looking at our memory verse and its context we find our savior was isolated, alienate from all other human relationships. He is lead by the Holy Spirit into the wilderness with the beasts (wild animals live), (*Mar 1:13 And he was there in the wilderness forty days, tempted of Satan; and was with the wild beasts....*) and God wants the readers to fully understand He [Our Savior] is alone. But the writer does not stop there, our savior was fasting, he ate nothing! Conditions are important so we can see how to overcome our own difficult situations for victory, to bring glory to God.

Luk 4:1-2 And Jesus being full of the Holy Ghost returned from Jordan, and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, Being forty days tempted of the devil. And in those days he did eat nothing: and when they were ended, he afterward hungered.

It's simple to understand, many of us will find ourselves completely alone, alienated, no one around and we are to be faithful to God! To obey his word! This also points to the conditions we may find ourselves in, showing no matter what the circumstances are, with food, no food, with covering, no covering, with protection, no protection (I'm speaking of our ability to protect ourselves physically). This confrontation of temptation between the Lord and the devil shows us we can and will be victorious should we obey the word of God! What comes to my mind are the early Christians who were fed to the wild dogs or lions for entertainment in the coliseum! Consider our beloved apostle Paul in his missionary journeys or our beloved apostle John being exiled to the Isle of Patmos for the witness of Jesus Christ! Read with me the follow witness of Paul to the Corinthians.

Endurance of the Apostle Paul

"2Co 11:23-30 Are they servants of Christ? I am a better one--I am talking like a madman--with far greater labors, far more imprisonments, with countless beatings, and often near death. Five times I received at the hands of the Jews the forty lashes less one. Three times I was beaten with rods. Once I was stoned. Three times I was shipwrecked; a night and a day I was adrift at sea; on frequent journeys, in danger from rivers, danger from robbers, danger from my own people, danger from Gentiles, danger in the city, danger in the wilderness, danger at sea, danger from false brothers; in toil and hardship, through many a sleepless night, in hunger and thirst, often without food, in cold and exposure. And, apart from other things, there is the daily pressure on me of my anxiety for all the churches. Who is weak, and I am not weak? Who is made to fall, and I am not indignant? If I must boast, I will boast of the things that show my weakness.

The God and Father of the Lord Jesus, he who is blessed forever, knows that I am not lying."

"In the course of this trial, it appears that our blessed Lord was tempted,

1st. To Distrust.
Command these stones to become bread.

2dly. To Presumption.
Cast thyself down.

3dly. To worldly Ambition. All these will I give.

4thly. To Idolatry. Fall down and worship me, or do me homage. There is probably not a temptation of Satan, but is reducible to one or other of these four articles.

From the whole we may learn:

First. No man, howsoever holy, is exempted from temptation: for God manifested to the flesh was tempted by the devil.

Secondly. That the best way to foil the adversary, is by the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, [Eph 6:17](#).

Thirdly. That to be tempted even to the greatest abominations (while a person resists) is not sin: for Christ was tempted to worship the Devil.

Fourthly. That there is no temptation which is from its own nature, or favoring circumstances, irresistible. God has promised to bruise even Satan under our feet."

So our savior's temptation is set in such a way that no one could miss-understand God is demonstrating the absolute dependency of man's need upon the word of God for victory of over temptation, sin!

Like I said last month, "So Christ shares with us a pattern for triumph over temptation which we can easily follow. Telling us over and over it's in knowing the will of God by the word of God." As we saw/read about Jesus saying "it is written" or "it is said" basing his entire defense against temptation from the devil by the living word of God!

*Heb 4:12 For the word of God is **living** and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart.*

We should remember what was said last month with regard to the sufficiency of God word to prepare a man for battle in righteousness, which is a life living out the word of God to the glory of God! Every good work!

2Ti 3:16-17 All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be competent, equipped for every good work.

Please let me repeat once again from last month's notes with regard to worshiping and serving our Lord Jesus Christ.

What does this all have to do with temptation, worshiping and serving God?

"Simply this, if you aren't committed to God from the heart with all of yourself, you will fall in times of testing! Because a heart set on fire for Jesus is careful before God, as not to offend but please him in every way. Why? Because you love him endlessly for all he is and all he does and all he has done for you."

Prayer

Lord Jesus, have mercy on us sinners who have sinned against you this day, this week, this month, and this year! Have mercy upon us Lord Jesus, for without you we cannot stand and apart for you we shall surely die. Fill us with boldness to proclaim your truth and walk in it. Help us Lord to not excuse ourselves from the task you have called us too that in all things we glorify you. Forgive our ministers, preacher, teacher, deacons, laymen and all others of faith for not willing publishing your truth. Forgive us if it be true that we hide behind your church walls and preach only in safe environment. God have mercy us who know your word well, if we should not proclaim it publicly in this dark world to the lost. Help us to follow your example and all your apostles and those whom you wrote about in your word. Amen

1Th 1:5-8 because our gospel came to you not only in word, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction. You know what kind of men we proved to be among you for your sake. And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for you received the word in much affliction, with the joy of the Holy Spirit, so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. For not only has the word of the Lord sounded forth from you in Macedonia and Achaia, but your faith in God has gone forth everywhere, so that we need not say anything.
